

**AUGUST 2019 Report for the Town of High level**

S/Sgt. Delaronde arrived on August 8<sup>th</sup> 2019 and commenced duties the same day.

August was a steady month with almost the same volume of call as 2018. The only real file of significance was the murder of an individual from Edmonton in the Town of High Level on September 9<sup>th</sup>. There has been one individual charged for 1<sup>st</sup> Degree murder.

RCMP members responded to 333 calls for Service in the Town of High Level, with the majority being calls that resulted in no charges being laid.

There were 13 assaults which includes 1 assault with a weapon, reported which resulted in 6 charges being laid.

There were 4 Break and Enters reported with 3 charges being aid.

There were 5 reports of impaired driving resulting in 3 charges being laid.

There were a total of 55 calls for service for mischief and incidents related to the liquor act which resulted in no charges, however most individuals involved in these calls were lodged until they were able to care for themselves or the likelihood of them continuing the offence was mitigated.

There were a total of 11 calls that related to the Mental Health Act or a well being check.

There were a total of 39 charges laid for failing to comply with conditions.

The bulk of the remaining call were in relation to provincial traffic related matters, accidents and general assistance to the General public.

### September 2019 Report for the Town of High level

Cst. Sierra Cairns arrived on **August 25<sup>th</sup>** 2019 High Level is her first posting.

September showed a decline from last year same time as well as down from the previous month.

RCMP members responded to 279 calls for Service in the Town of High Level, with the majority being calls that resulted in no charges being laid.

There were 15 assaults which includes 2 assault with a weapon, reported which resulted in 10 charges being laid and 2 being deemed unfounded.

There were 5 Break and Enters reported with 1 charges being laid, 2 were unfounded and 2 had insufficient evidence to proceed to charges.

There were 0 reports of impaired driving.

There were a total of 75 calls for service for mischief and incidents related to the liquor act which resulted in no charges, however most individuals involved in these calls were lodged until they were able to care for themselves or the likelihood of them continuing the offence had diminished to they point it was no longer an issue.

There were a total of 13 calls that related to the Mental Health Act or a well being check.

There were a total of 29 charges laid for failing to comply with conditions.

There was 1 charge laid under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA) for possession of Cocaine

1 charge was laid for Identity Fraud

3 reports of forcible confinement which resulted in 1 charge, 1 was unfounded and 1 had no evidence to proceed.

The bulk of the remaining call were in relation to provincial traffic related matters, accidents and general assistance to the General public.

### October 2019 Report for the Town of High level

October showed an increase from last year same time as well as an increase from the previous month.

RCMP members responded to 377 calls for Service in the Town of High Level, with the majority being calls that resulted in no charges being laid.

There were 6 assaults which includes 1 assault with a weapon, reported which resulted in 1 charges being laid and 2 being deemed unfounded and 2 still under investigation.

There were 9 Break and Enters reported with 5 charges being laid, 2 had insufficient evidence to proceed to charges and 21 are still under investigation.

There were 5 reports of impaired driving by either drugs or alcohol resulting in 3 charges, 2 were deemed unfounded and 1 was Insufficient evidence to proceed.

There were a total of 91 calls for service for mischief and incidents related to the liquor act which resulted in no charges, however most individuals involved in these calls were lodged until they were able to care for themselves or the likelihood of them continuing the offence had diminished to they point it was no longer an issue.

There were a total of 11 calls that related to the Mental Health Act or a well being check.

There were a total of 23 charges laid for failing to comply with conditions.

There were 2 charge laid for driving while disqualified.

28 charges laid under the Provisions of the Traffic Safety Act (TSA) .

6 reports of missing individuals' and all were resolved by the missing individual being located.

There was a report of robbery which resulted in charges being laid.

1 report of sexual assault resulting in charges being laid.

1 file was opened under the provisions of the Coroners Act.

The bulk of the remaining call were in relation to assistance to other agencies, accidents and general assistance to the General public.

RCMP members responded to 223 calls for Service in the Town of High Level, with the majority being calls that resulted in no charges being laid.

There were 14 assaults which includes 1 assault with a weapon, reported which resulted in 7 charges being laid and 4 being deemed unfounded and 1 insufficient evidence to proceed.

There were 1 Break and Enters reported with 1 charge being laid.

There were 1 reports of impaired driving by either drugs or alcohol resulting in Insufficient evidence to proceed.

There were a total of 71 calls for service for mischief and incidents related to the liquor act which resulted in no charges, however most individuals involved in these calls were lodged until they were able to care for themselves or the likelihood of them continuing the offence had diminished to they point it was no longer an issue.

There were a total of 10 calls that related to the Mental Health Act or a well being check.

There were a total of 19 charges laid for failing to comply with conditions.

There were 2 charges laid for driving while disqualified.
